Transitioning to school

"Creating a positive experience for a child transitioning to school is paramount. This is the next step in a child's life" (Dockett and Perry 2001). It is an important milestone. At Bright Star we are here to support parents and their children in the transition process. We work with families to make sure they are informed and comfortable with the transition process. We also ensure that the necessary information is provided to parents about all the local schools in the area. A teacher has visited each school and has introduced themselves to the principle, in order to foster a partnership between the school and our centre.

The team also take children who will be starting school for a walk to the school to show them where it is and also use Koru group time to talk to them about what happens at school and answer any questions they may have. It is a great time for the older children to also explore any curriculum areas that interest them in more depth. If you have any questions about the transition process please ask your key teacher or Linda.

Pukeko group programme

Currently our under 2 children are showing an interest in manipulating their bodies and motion. In the outdoors environment, our children are enjoying climbing, balancing and riding bikes and cars. The children have been practicing manipulating their body onto the slide,
